The Certificate III in Apparel, Fashion and Textiles aims to equip you with the necessary skills in sewing, patternmaking, and industry processes for creating garments. As a student in this program, you'll gain a working knowledge of fabric identification, fabric cutting, pattern-making methods, sewing techniques, laying-up, professional finishing, and alterations, all of which are key skills in this vital industry.

Whether you are currently working in the sector or are wanting to start fresh, the program will give you essential skills which can be put to good use in the clothing production and alteration business.
