Entry requirements

You will need a minimum level of skill in listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Previous industry experience: students must be employed or volunteering in a community services/ECEC/AGED/ health services workplace. Digital capability: students must be computer literate.

Considerations

Attendance at evening meetings and occasional weekend activities can be expected.

Community work also requires extensive travel within local and regional communities and considerable personal contact with members from all walks of life.
